What is the degree?

The BASRM is designed to help working adults complete degrees as quickly as possible with concentrations in Human Resource Management, Manufacturing Management and Unified Public Safety. This degree was designed in collaboration with staff from the Louisiana Community and Technical College System (LCTCS) for adult learners who hold an associate degree, although an associate degree is not a requirement for admission to the program.

Who should enroll?

If you work in emergency preparedness at a hospital, a business or for a local municipality, the Unified Public Safety concentration would be a great option for you. If you work at a paper mill or wood products plant, the Manufacturing Management concentration might be perfect for you. If you work in a position in a company and would like to move into management, the Human Resources concentration would be incredibly helpful for your career goals.
